Points of interest from the last meeting

Extract of newsworthy items from the minutes of the last meeting. Note: Some events/activities may have concluded or been modified as circumstances change.

1. Roy Gladman Round 3 Scale

After some discussion it was decided to schedule this event for Sunday December 10th with Sunday December 17th a backstop in case of bad weather.

2. Field Maintenance

3. Xmas Party venue and date

On Sunday 3rd December, Nathan Aggett brought a small Cessna 182 powered by a 61 four stroke engine out to the field for a test flight. Nathan asked me (Roger) to fly it and fortunately all went okay. Once in the air it flew much the same as my TopFlite Cessna 182. However on the second flight after Nathan made a few adjustments it cart wheeled as it lifted off, luckily very little damage was sustained. Must be a strong model! Take off was directly into wind which was probably a little too strong for a small model,

then as soon as it lifted the wind got under the left wing and over it went. I suspect it lifted off a little too soon – should've kept it on the strip longer to gain more speed so less elevator required. I'm sure Nathan will have it back out again on the next flying weekend. I hope we can get it sorted out because it flew very nicely.

It was quite a busy morning that Sunday. We had a visitor (I'm a shocker with names) who works with Rob Beardall out with his new model. I (Roger) also test flew it and all went well although its quite a busy model to fly. After the first flight the owner who can obviously fly took off and put it through its paces. Our visitor said he was getting married shortly and would be back out to join the club early in the new year.
