Points of interest from the last meeting

Extract of newsworthy items from the minutes of the last meeting. Note: Some events/activities may have concluded or been modified as circumstances change.

1. Annual Display 1st April – Sub Committee Report

- a) The sub committee held a meeting on 7th February and was attended by Max Rowan, Graeme Allen, Gordon Hicks, Glenn White and Nick Katsikaros. Nick took minutes of the meeting and distributed to all attendees.
- b) Glenn jotted down the names of members who are prepared to help out on both days. Saturday involves setting up of field and perhaps some practice flying. We have booked into Stockland Wendoureee for Saturday 31st March to promote the event and sell some raffle tickets.
- c) It is anticipated that the Geelong and Haddon (Ballarat Aero Modellers) clubs will assist with flying displays.
- d) Glenn White and Graeme Allen to organize and look after canteen.
- e) Plan to run a swap tent like they do at Hamilton.
- f) No Pilot entry fee there will be some giveaways and trophies.
- g) Public entry \$3/person, \$5 car load.
- h) Secretary to contact Peter Taylor regarding small wrapped sweets from Masterfoods for the lolly drop.
- The Secretary passed the proposed raffle ticket design around the meeting for comment. There was some concern regarding the wording of the

prize. The wording has been changed to *CAP231* aerobatic ARF aircraft kit by World Model Manuf'g. Requires engine up to 91FS & radio gear. 57" wingspan. Value \$265. The kit was kindly donated by Rojs Hobbies last year.

2. Field Maintenance

- a) Murri Anstis has fitted the roof on the container.
- b) Runway improvements:
 - i) Max Rowan is to go ahead and get 3 tarps for the proposed runway improvements.
 - ii) Graeme Allen advised that there will be some matting material (30m x 2.7m) available in WA shortly and is hoping to organize some free transport. It would probably take 12 months to get sufficient to cover runways.
 - iii) Rick Pimblott advised that his source for similar matting would not be available until July. Matting which is 30m x 5-6m is used in paper manufacture (That being the case, it is probably the same material as that used at the Twin Cities club field at Albury). One of these mats would be available every 6 months.
- c) Wiring in kitchen and light outside shed are still on the agenda.

3. Bus to Avalon 2007 – 25th March

Gordon Hicks has organized the bus to Avalon. There are still a few seats available so contact Gordon if you want a ride to air show. The Bus will be leaving from the Ballarat Library car park at 7:30AM. So be there on time. There will be some light refreshments for the trip home. The cost is \$15 per seat.

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4. Club Banner

It was decided to proceed with the club banner. Secretary to ask Peter Taylor to proceed with order from Barlett's in Ring Road. (A yellow Banner 1500mm x 750mm has been ordered for pickup on Monday 19th March – Cost \$62.50) We then need to get some sign writing done.

5. Roy Gladman Comp Direction

The number of entries in the aerobatic and scale events has never lived up to expectation whilst the novelty event has always attracted a good entry. With this in mind it was suggested that we modify the format of the Roy Gladman event. It was suggested that we merge some simple aerobatics into the novelty event and continue to hold it during February/March each year. The aerobatic and scale events will be replaced with club days where we will have a BBQ lunch. This will be discussed at future meetings with the view to make sure we get a good roll up on the days.

6. Other Items

- a) The Returning Officer asked the newsletter editor to include the Committee 2007/8 nomination form in the next newsletter. (Nomination form is included with this newsletter)
- b) The newsletter editors were also asked to include a Methanol/Nitro methane safety data sheet in the newsletter. Once the editors get this info it will be included in the next newsletter.

On Sunday 11th March Glenn had his Cessna 195 out at the field for its first engine run and some taxi trials. This is the biggest engine Glenn has had and he's a little frightened of it. He doesn't want to get bitten by that prop if it back fires on starting. After some fiddling we managed to get the Zenoah 62 running and it ticked over beautifully – no adjustments needed. Glenn has since constructed a muffler that can be housed within the cowl to replace the supplied muffler.

Crash Report

On Sunday 11th March Rick brought out his Hawker Hurricane for an airing. Graeme was the pilot and was in trouble from the start because the engine was not performing adequately. The hurricane lifted off nicely but immediately it was apparent that the engine had lost power

making climb out difficult. Graeme struggled to gain height but as you all know, you have make a 180 degree turn soon after take off. On the down wind leg the hurricane flipped over on its back and started a death spiral toward the ground. Graeme did exceptionally well to let the model gain air speed and pull it out of its dive and gain some sort of control to put it down with wings level. The resulting landing was fairly heavy causing some minor damage to the U/C and one wing tip. On examination Rick found that the rudder horn had snapped and wondered if this was the cause of the loss of control because he doesn't think the rudder contacted the ground during the forced landing to snap the horn. Rick is investigating a more powerful engine probably petrol to replace the large methanol engine.

We can say goodbye to Max's well worn pattern ship. Whilst competing in the Roy Gladman comps he took off with the Spitfire Tx model setting instead of the pattern ship and the ailerons were reversed. You can imagine what happened!

What ever he did must have worked because the Cirrus made it into the air. He did a few circuits and everything was great until guess what? – the nose wheel fell out again landing over near the entry gate. Fortunately some visitors were just arriving and noticed something falling off the plane and fetched it for Graeme. We can't recommend A1 as a mechanic but must admit the landing was good. (Stop Press! We saw a full size Cirrus down at Avalon so suggested to Graeme that he have a good look at the nose wheel. I think there was some rude finger gesturing)

Warrnambool

On the weekend of March 3rd/4th five of us went down to Warrnambool for their annual fly-in. This is a great weekend, one to be highly recommended. The flying field is excellent, they actually have green grass!! The Warrnambool club put on a good weekend and attracted some nice models. It was a little windy on the Saturday but Sunday was perfect. We all had a fly A1 flew his Super Cub and nearly flew his Cirrus but the nose leg fell off on the way to the flight line (on the threat of being sued we can make no comment). I flew my new Hornet and took the Cessna 195 for static. Roger took best A.R.F. with his Shoestring (buyers remorse has nearly gone now) and Rick got best scratch built with his Pinnman bi-plane.

Some other models to note where Murry Ellis' multi engine fun fly, it has four 46 sized motors.

There was a large Kawasaki (Hein or Tony) with a 75cc 3W motor, very impressive in the air and sure didn't lack for power.



It's a small radial engine out of a WW2 Stuart tank. The owner ran it a few times throughout the day.

One of the W'Bool members brought a motor along for 'show and tell' which came on a 6x4 trailer (see photo). He ran it a few times during Sunday to the crowd's delight. It made a lot of noise (coughing and spluttering flames out the exhaust). The 7 cylinder radial was not out of an aircraft as we all expected but out of a WWII Stuart tank.

The model landed okay and was patched up for another go.
