Points of interest from the last meeting

1. Field Development

- a) Max has finished the compound behind the container.
- b) The solid laminate sheets have been removed as part of field clean up.
- c) We now need some one to lend a hand to finish off the toilet building. Fitting the remainder of the internal lining, hanging doors and painting are the main tasks to be done.
- d) We borrowed a tractor and slasher from Bruce Wiseman machinery last Saturday and cut the grass around the edges of the runways. While we had the slasher, a third runway was cut between the ends of the two existing runways forming a triangular area in the centre. This area was then cut down also with the intention that you will ultimately be able to land on it after it has been cut a few times. The runways will still define where you should land but it will give a little extra leeway.
- e) Propose to attach some of the floor sheeting to the metal frames so they can be used as seats/benches etc.
- f) Glenn said that he will get some blue gums to plant around our facilities.

2. Electric Fence

The sheep sh## around the buildings and pit area is becoming a nuisance. It was decide that we will erect the electric fence that the club owns around the buildings and pit area to see if it will

keep the sheep out. It is not practical to try and keep them off the runway and in any case the mower breaks it up satisfactorily.

3. Club Trainer

The issue of club trainer has arisen because it is recognized that if we are to have one it is essential that it is easy to fly and reliable, so it encourages potential new members to embrace the sport/hobby.

Murray Anstis said that he has an RCM Trainer that the club can have. It requires covering and takes a 40 size motor. Graeme Allen thought that he might have a motor that will suit. We will need someone who can finish it off, fit the radio from the existing trainer and get it flying. The meeting thought that a \$100 budget would be sufficient to get it going.

If we can't get a satisfactory trainer up and running this way, and the club determines that it is a worthwhile exercise, then we will need to consider purchasing an ARF trainer and motor.

Once we have a reliable trainer operational, the issue of advertising it with the prospect of attracting people into the hobby was raised. It was recognized that we will need to draft some rules/guidelines to cover its operation.

4. APA Event

Roger Carrigg advised the meeting that Henry Hutchinson rang yesterday to say that the APA has decided NOT to hold their event at our field on 2/3 February 2002. He stated that after their representatives visited our field recently they were concerned about the long tufted grass surrounding the runways and that it may damage

5. VCCC Event

Roger Carrigg also advised the meeting that last year we agreed to put on a flying display at our field for the Victorian Classis Car Club on Sunday morning 17th February. We need as many flyers as possible so that we can put on a reasonable show. There will possibly be a lunchtime barbecue.

6. OZKOSH

Max Rowan is to contact Col Pinkerton for the contact person at the airport who owns the hangar where we had our display last year. We might limit it to a single day display this year probably Sunday.

7. Annual Display

After studying the event calendar to ensure that we do not clash with other events, the date for our display has been set for Sunday 21st April 2002. It was decided to hold a meeting at Roger Carrigg's house next Wednesday night 7:30 PM to plan the event.

8. Request to fly at Lethbridge

Hart Walker – 9th/10th March at Lethbridge Airport. Lions club is raising funds to purchase a machine to benefit kids with Cerebral Palsy. Ted Hardcastle from Dereel is trying to organize some aircraft. We need to get a permit to fly from the VMAA. If successful we will need about 6 members.

Model flies well but Wayne still has difficulties landing it. Peter Barnett has scratch built a very attractive red and white Citabria powered by an OS91FS. It is a long time since we have seen a model of such high standard.

The water tanks have all been erected and plumbed to toilet basin, urinal, and kitchen sink.

Rob Beardall spent last Saturday morning digging a trench and laying conduit and cable to enable generator to be located under the toilet block keeping noise to a minimum.

The Site office now has a servery at one end. New cupboards and benches are the next project. Also to fit a gas hot plate donated by Graham Waterhouse.

We now have a larger mown car park area behind the toilet. Max has done a great job making a portable fence, which spans the whole front of the site shed and garage keeping the sheep out.

We are also experimenting with a third runway. No excavation work has been done, just the use of a slasher and mowers. Surprisingly it has come up rather well. There is just a couple of hollows to fill.
