Points of interest from the last meeting

1. Field Development

- a) Max Rowan reported that the shed frame is partially erected and is now ready to have the roof purlins attached. Wall cladding and roofing can then be fitted.
- b) Noel Findlay advised that he is investigating steel joists to support the flooring material that we have.
- c) The toilet requires the doors to be fitted, the wall lining to be finished off. Once that is done, it is ready for painting inside.
- d) Max advised that he has come across some timber packs in Geelong that we can have for free. It consists of 6m lengths of framing timber that is seconds or for some reason cannot be sold. The meeting thought that it would be a worthwhile acquisition.
- e) Max restated that the road in is a problem where the water is over the track. Moorabool Shire is to re-grade it when it dries out. Some crushed rock will probably be needed to raise the road level. It is unlikely that digging out the drainage channel towards the gate would be successful due to the slope of the land.
- f) Max pointed out that the lock has been changed at the old Bowes Road field. BRMFC no longer has any connection with that site.

2. Fund Raising

Sausage Sizzle held on Saturday 22nd September outside the Safeway store in Sebastopol. The following is a brief breakdown of the fund raising event.

- a) Ran from 9:30AM to 1:30PM, busiest time around 11:30AM
- b) A permit was obtained from Ballarat Council.
- c) The club made almost \$200 from the event.

The next sausage sizzle is scheduled for Saturday 10^{th} November at the Eastwood street shopping centre.

3. Raffle

Glenn White spoke on the desirability of running a raffle to be drawn at the end of the year.

The meeting decided on the following points.

- a) Limit cost of prizes to \$500
- b) Budget to sell 1000 tickets at \$2 per ticket (\$2000)
- c) Three prizes.

- d) Wally James then very kindly donated second prize to the value of \$150 from Sebastopol Auto Sales. The meeting thanked Wally.
- e) Noel Findlay said that he would speak to Matt Billett about the first prize.

4. First Aid Kit

Rick Pimblott has kindly donated a new First Aid kit that is to be kept in the clubhouse. We still require some band-aids to supplement the kit contents.

5. Spring Wing Dereel

Glenn White, Max Rowan and Roger Carrigg advised the following.

- a) Some members of the local Dereel community are running this event called Spring Wing to raise money for the local community and CFA. It is to be held on Saturday 17th November 2001.
- b) The event focuses around ultra light aviation but includes other displays and activities.
- c) They would like our club to put on a static and flying display.
- d) On Sunday 9th September, Glenn White, Max Rowan and Roger Carrigg went down to meet them and to inspect the flying site. It is basically a north/south runway about 2000 feet long flanked by trees on either side. The flying will be safe with respect to spectators, but it will be a lot tighter than most fliers are familiar with. We will need some nice models for static and others for flying.
- e) A permit to fly application was sent off to the VMAA on 17th September for approval.
- f) Noel Findlay mentioned that the club needs some sort of set up to display models at these events. Tent with open side and hessian around it.

6. Begonia Rally for the Victorian Classic Car Club

Col Pinkerton requested that the following be brought up at the meeting in his absence.

Next year the Begonia Rally for the VCCC would like to visit the BRMFC field late morning on Sunday 17th February 2002 to see a flying display.

Figures are vague at the moment, but it looks like about 200 people and 100 cars.

There would be a minimum donation of \$100. This may increase depending on the amount of sponsorship is received.

The VCCC would also pay for the fire brigade to be in attendance for the duration of the visit.

I would appreciate you bringing this before the meeting for me.

The meeting saw no problem with this request and offered the clubs services on the day.

Spring Wing Festival – 17th November

This has already been mentioned above in the *points* of interest from the last meeting. The club has been approached by a community group at Dereel to put on a model aircraft static and flying demonstration on Saturday 17th November 2001. They are running an event called Spring Wing, which involves ultra-light aircraft, vintage/veteran/classic cars and rides for the kids etc. It is being run on private property at Dereel where there is a 2000 foot runway. We have

submitted an application to the VMAA for a permit to fly. Once again we will need some members who have models that they would like to put in the static display. Flying will depend on the permit application being successful and the conditions on the day being favorable. Notwithstanding that, flying must be restricted to experienced pilots due to the tight nature of the area.
