Safety is something that cannot be stressed too strongly. We must all think wisely before we fly our aircraft and always be aware of the potential risk to bystanders and fellow modelers. None of us would like to be placed in this tragic situation.

## Points of interest from the last meeting

Please note: Some of these items/events may have changed since the meeting.

#### 1. Life Member Guidelines

Due to Tom Jobling's absence discussion was held over until the next meeting.

#### 2. Field Maintenance

- **a)** Max Rowan stated that Moorabool Shire is satisfied with the paperwork.
- **b)** Require the Plumber & Gasfitters Registration Board compliance form to be signed off by a licensed plumber.

Action: Glenn White to organize sign off by a licensed plumber.

Action: Secretary to locate form amongst our paperwork.

#### 3. Runway Earth Works

Peter Barnett has received a verbal quote of \$400 from Midwest Earth Movers to remove mound where the runways intersect. Meeting agreed that we should proceed with this work after our Annual Display day. Max Rowan stated that he has run this past the Fiskens, their only concern is the dust it may create. (this would be of concern to us also). The work needs to be done before it gets too wet.

# 4. Temporary Food Premises – Tuesday 18th March

Glenn White and Pam Pimblott attended the Temporary Food Premises seminar held at the Town Hall. Pam has got all the paperwork ready to submit to the Moorabool Shire so that a permit can be issued enabling us to sell food on our display day.

## 5. Annual Display – 30<sup>th</sup> March

The annual display was discussed at length and the following points were noted.

- a) Graeme Allen stated that he will need about 15 helpers on the day.
  - i) 2 on gate on a rotation basis.
  - ii) 1 in the car park.
  - iii) 4 in canteen.

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- iv) 2 in the pound.
- v) 1 in pits.
- vi) 2 on flight line.
- b) Noel Findlay has organized and picked up the 5 pilot trophies at a cost of \$61.50.
- June Waterhouse has offered help with food preparation and sales.
- d) As usual we will charge a \$5 pilot entry fee to offset the cost of prizes and trophies.
- e) Free tea and coffee to pilots. (They will have a tag pinned on which canteen staff can see)
- f) Max R. stated that new star pickets are now out at the field.
- g) Max R. also stated that the toilets will be going out on Friday.
- Hugh McCormick said that he will do the mowing on Friday.
- i) Max said that he is getting the spray paint machine from Coates Wreckair.
- Working Bee to start at 10:00AM on Saturday morning.
- k) Graeme A. reported that he spoke to the fire brigade today and they didn't think that it was necessary to attend. G. A. to speak to Geoff Fisken tomorrow. Fire brigade to attend if Geoff Fisken requires them.
- 1) Road signs need to be cleaned and washed.
- m) Roger Carrigg reported that we have two prospective stall holders. One sells a Flight Simulator whilst the other foam gliders. They have been asked to make a donation at the end of the day. There was some concern expressed having the foam gliders. It was decided to allow them this time.
- n) Max R. reported that the Ultra Light aircraft will be flying in at around 11.00 AM. We have radio contact with them to ensure that all models are on the ground while they land.
- Max R. to follow up generator from Coates Wreckair. More economical and quieter than ours.
- p) Prizes will be awarded by calling out numbers during the day. Murray Anstis pointed out that he would like to see everyone get a prize.
- q) Pilot entry and pilot's choice forms required.
- r) We will be running a controlled flight line and all pilots will require a caller.
- s) Wally James has very kindly donated the cost of the tilt tray truck to take toilets out to field.
- t) Roger Carrigg passed the proof copy of our advertisement that is to appear in the Courier on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> March. Minor correction required for field location. Courier to be notified tomorrow.

#### 6. Safety Issues

Grahame Waterhouse raised the point that the Safety Officers should check all new models at the field. Murray Anstis added that he has mentioned to suppliers our concerns about airworthiness of some of the ARF models that we have flown lately.



## **VMAA News**

This will be a regular feature in the newsletter and will include items taken from the minutes of the previous VMAA Executive meeting which are sent to all club secretaries.

1. State Field Official Open Day

The weekend of November  $22^{nd}/23^{rd}$  has been set aside for the official opening of the State Flying Field. The format of the event is still being decided by the VMAA Executive. A budget of \$2500 has been budgeted for this event.

- 2. Seven heavy model permits were submitted for approval during February.
- 3. As of now the VMAA has 2118 Senior members, 255 Junior members, 445 Pensioners and 10 Life members making a grand total of 2828. This represents an increase of 68 over the previous month.
- 4. VMAA Badges are available from the VMAA Secretary. Cloth badges \$3, enamel badges \$5, self adhesive decal sheet \$3.



# New Models seen at field

It has been a quiet month as far as new models are concerned. Wayne has had his new 72" span CAP 232 out in the pits unsuccessfully trying to get the Saito 180 twin to run on both cylinders. Model has flown a couple of times but has lost power on one cylinder shortly after take off. Model flew reasonably well on one cylinder so it should give excellent performance when both cylinders are firing.

Last Saturday (19<sup>th</sup> April) Roger test flew his P39 Airacobra that he built way back in 1976. The model is from a Top Flite kit and was built to fly in Stand Off Scale at the Bunbury WA Nationals in 1976. It was originally powered by a Webra 61 2 stroke and had Kraft Series 75 radio gear with Kraft MultiCon retracts and flaps. After hanging up for some 25 years it has been brought out of retirement for the up and coming military scale event at Wagga.

The P39 is now powered by a new Magnum 80 four stroke and has a servo out at each aileron instead of the single servo in the centre section. The Kraft electric retracts are still used but they now have their own battery pack. Actuation is via a JR 371 mini servo operating a micro switch.

After running two tanks of fuel through the Magnum to break it in, it was time to fly. The manufacturers break in procedure was followed to the letter and the Magnum seems to run quite well. Starts easily and idles well with very little vibration.

The P39 tracked straight down the runway and eased gently into the air. It felt a bit heavy on the elevator but 3 clicks of up trim fixed that. Ailerons did not require any trim at all. After flying around for a few minutes the

undercarriage was raised and the P39 looked very realistic in the air. It was then time to try the flaps. Throttle was brought back to 50% and the flaps were lowered (about 20 degrees). The P39 did not show much nose up attitude like the Cessna does so it seems that down elevator mixing is not required. The flaps were then raised and a few more circuits were flown before it was decided to land.

It was decided to use flaps on landing so power was pulled back to about 1/3 and the flaps were lowered on the down wind leg. The P39 negotiated the 180 degree turn onto finals and was set up for landing. Just a little extra throttle was needed to slow its descent and when it was over the runway the throttle was closed and the P39 kissed the runway for the first time in 25 years.

In summary a 90 four stroke would give it a bit more power but hopefully the 80 will develop a bit more power as it runs in. The P39 weighs 9lb 5 oz dry.

## **Crash Report**

Max is first up this month. Whilst competing in the combat event on our open day Max crashed his old worn out weather beaten high wing sport model. (No great loss although all models are precious to some extent) We don't think that max expected to take the model home in one piece. Thanks Max for giving the public what they came to see. Congratulations on the "Mug" award.

On a more serious note, sad to say that on the same day but after the event Rick lost his large scale De Havilland Beaver. Whilst having a leisurely flight one wing broke away and the Beaver spiraled into the ground. It appears that the wing strut or connections failed.

This was an ARF model and one would assume that the airframe is structurally sound and the fittings are strong enough to do the job. It just goes to show that we should not assume anything. It has been seen of late that a lot of ARF models leave a lot to be desired in this area. It is amazing the effect one small item can have. (ie Destruction of the aircraft).

When you have a bad run you have a bad run. Last Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> April Rick lost another one of his models. This time it was his Stuka that he planned to take to Wagga. Cause of crash hasn't been established. Rick thinks it may have been the radio. Whilst on a landing circuit Rick lost control of model, he had time to hand Tx to Graeme A. but Graeme was unable to gain control as it spiraled into the ground some distance from the flight line. Sadly model looks to be beyond repair. Bad luck Rick.
