Points of interest from the last meeting

Extract of newsworthy items from the minutes of the last meeting. Note: Some events/activities may have concluded or been modified as circumstances change.

- 8. General Business
- a) Trawalla Estate Update No issues or matters to present.
- b) Strategic Plan (SP) Development and discussion. A person who has experience in developing one would be preferred as the lead in its development. Ray Turner volunteered to take up the task. Meeting date set for 7th April 2018.
- c) Field Maintenance -
- Questions asked regarding the Hazchem signage requirements, "Are signs required on the container and the gate?"; "Are MSDs etc. required to be available?" Nick volunteered to research the relevant regulations.
- Both of the containers need to be better ventilated to remove fumes.
- A leaking jerry can needs to be disposed of.
- Authority given to purchase a spout for the fuel jerry cans.
- d) Burrumbeet Airstrip No progress (awaiting a meeting with Paul Brumby).

- e) Display Day 2018
- Net loss of approximately \$184. It was deemed to be still worthwhile as exposure was very good, a surprisingly good number of the public attended, it was estimated at one point there was in excess of 40 cars in the public car park
- Discussion ensued whether the club should have another display next year or only have a "fly-in". This will require further discussion and await the outcome of the VMAA's review of the display procedure before a final decision will be made
- Roger Carrigg received a telephone call late in the week from Norm Thompson of the VMAA saying an officer from CASA had contacted him stating they had no knowledge of the BRMFC display. This prompted changes to be made to our flyer and RCTrader notice.
- The roadside signs were insufficient in number to adequately direct people to the field. Their careful placement is needed to avoid any issues with VicRoads. A more detailed map in future will be placed on the flyers and any advertisements.
- The background music requires more planning for next year; it was ad hoc and the choice of tracks was poor (in some people's opinion).

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- A suggestion was made to invite attending non-gold wing level pilots to fly after the formal display has completed.
- Compliments and thanks were expressed to the pilots who were brave enough to fly. These were "bomber" Nick K., "aerobatic" Alan C., "grooving" Graeme A., "Robust" Roger C. and Nathaniel's incredible quad copter flying.
- Letter of thanks to be sent to Craig Butterworth for the loan of the PA system.
- The canteen was well run, food excellent and tea hot thanks go to the entire canteen "staff".
- There was great support from BAMI with many of their members attending and providing models for static display.
- A local resident and his wife attended and even loaned a large TV for the FPV quad copter flying.
- No obvious place for "gold coin donations" from the public was available which caused some confusion.
- The attending public's feedback should be sought next year with the aim to find out for example how they were made aware of the display, what they did and didn't like about the day.
- More club members need to be encouraged to fly at the display. If necessary assistance to prepare piloting skills and models to handle any presenting conditions can be given. With a view to help enable this, workshops may be held to train for the gaining of wings and for model set up.
- 9. Other Business
- Workshops begin with an hour or two on a Sunday with the aim being to gain "Confident Solo flight skills". These may be held at the field monthly, with potential educators being Roger, Glenn, Murri, Nick, Peter and Max.
- The member survey was shown comments were invited with some suggestions made on the content. The decision was made to distribute via email and it may be completed electronically or printed and manually filled in. Some forms and envelopes will be in the canteen building at the Trawalla field and once completed can be placed in the marked and sealed box just opposite the entry. This will enable privacy to be maintained for those members preferring this.
- VFSAA day in March going ahead on 25th March (as far as we know).
- Joint BRMFC/BAMI club day Sunday 8th April 2018 at the Trawalla field. BBQ lunch supplied by BRMFC. Hopefully with demonstrations of tug and winch launched gliders. (Since rescheduled to Sunday 22nd April).
- Bunnings sausage sizzle and information day both went well.
- MAAA notice regarding grant funding available was received, however we are not eligible next year for a grant as we received funding for the AED this year.
- 10. Meeting closed at 9.16pm Next meeting 28th March.

Paul also came down to the Hamilton & Warrnambool fun flies a few times so members of those clubs may remember him.

On Sunday morning (25th March) Sam and Donna came out to the flying field and had a good chat with many of the members who knew their father. It was good to make contact with them and talk about our time with Paul.

BRMFC Web Site

The club web site has been displaying the CFA fire ban status RSS feed on the home and weather pages from 16th November to 15th April since 4th November 2010. (Outside those dates it's unnecessary to display it.)

All of a sudden I noticed an error on or around 12th March so had a look to see what had gone wrong. It turned out the CFA web site now uses SSL/TLS protocol for the feed (https instead of http) and this stopped our site from displaying the feed.

Another thing, if displaying the club web site on a mobile device the **Weatherzone** feed may not display which includes the small temperature & wind velocity panel on the upper left side of every page. On Android, under options you need to select Request desktop site. Presumably iPhone is similar.

Alan has been kind

enough to provide us with an insight into his aeromodelling background:

I have been flying for a little over 5 years now, starting out when a good friend of mine introduced me to micro helicopters. I soon got bored so I bought my first foamy, a short wing cub. After a lot of bif, bash and CRASH, I soon got the hang of it and I was hooked. As my planes got bigger and faster the local footy oval became much too small, so Tony and myself joined Lilydale aero (LDMFA) in 2014.

About ½ of my planes are scratch built Depron foam, and the other half ARF kits, which have all been modified to some extent, as you do.(more POWER....) Joining an aero club was the best thing I could have done, learning from likeminded people and passing on my knowledge to those who ask.







VMAA News

Information gathered from the Minutes of the VMAA Executive Committee Meeting held on the 8th Feb 2018 which might be of interest to members.

GMAA Loan application

Murray Ellis (President GMAA Geelong Miniature Aircraft Association) spoke at length re the setting up of the new field (ed. have to find out location) following the closure after many years of the (Geelong) Dog Rocks field. While there has been some loss of members the club remains strong and the road to the field has now been completed with the erection of a clubhouse about to start.

The club has committed some \$30k towards the project but is asking the VMAA for a loan to help complete the works. VMAA vice president Jon Goudge explained to Murray that the VMAA would like to help and that we would discuss a loan for some specific items to help with the capital works project as explained by Murray with supporting documentation. Loan was agreed in principal but with the absence of both the VMAA president and treasurer it was decided to defer until they were consulted as well.

State Field Reports

Northern Flying Group

Many start up poles have been replaced. The IMAC SIG event was well attended and the event was a success with the flying and also the fundraising side for the club, thanks to all. New Fencing has been completed and another SIG-F1 Racing will hold an event in March (this might be May) with a night fly and BBQ. VMAA will sponsor trophies for the event up to \$110.

Bairnsdale

Extra works at the State field are progressing quite well. The last half of 2017 has been difficult as there was very little rainfall leaving the surrounds in poor condition however the regulars have been keeping our airstrip in beautiful condition throughout, by regular application of bore water. There has been quite a lot done to improve the drainage around the pits to ensure the field is useable immediately after wet days. Hasn't really been tested yet.

New works are to lay grass matting EX Bairnsdale Tennis courts, a very nice donation delivered on site. We will be using this mat for taxiways and also on some of the pits.

Work is planned before our Labour Day Scale event.

BADMAC members are giving the field a good workout with attendances of 20 to 30 on the two biggest days Wednesday and Sunday, however the beautiful facility is being to some extent wasted as there are no SIG or other events planned for this year at the present.

Last year, due largely to the number of members who committed themselves to work on Bunnings Sausage sizzles we were able to purchase a new and better quality Husqvarna Mower to make it easier for our Airport Manager to keep the Airstrip in pristine condition.

The next expense which we are saving toward but is probably beyond our resources is that we need to top off the gravel area as that received only a very thin coating initially, with grader the works will probably cost about \$10k.

Echuca

Country Visit and opening on the 5th and 6th of May Fun fly as advertised. Field in great condition and new buildings in great shape.

Mt Wallace

New runway earth works have not yet been started due to site availability. They are due to commence soon. A temporary runway is in use with no problems. Membership in the club (BMMAA) is growing steadily with a further 2 new members last month.

Earthworks are due to commence end of February and Runway sow about early April.

Currently getting power connected in readiness for the watering required when the runway is sown, bore and pump are already completed. Funding is being discussed and will be formalized at the March meeting.

Quotes for toilet block and clubhouse are being sought and will be tabled at a later date.

Display Day – Sunday 25th February

BRMFC held its display day on Sunday 25th February under extremely challenging conditions. A few days before the event we were also confronted with a contentious issue with our display permit. Although it was dry, the wind from the south east was very strong, over 40km/h and gusting up around 50km/h at times according to BoM.

With the blustery conditions only a few members flew, however we managed to have models in the air for most of the gazetted display time. Nick flew his Edge, Graeme flew his low wing sport model, Alan Crisp (new member) had his electric ducted fan jet up and I the trusty old Shoestring. It was just too strong for biplanes and other light weight models.

BAMI, our sister club in Ballarat turned up in numbers to support our event, many thanks to those who attended.

We had a much better spectator turn out this year compared to last year no doubt helped by our concerted efforts promoting the event via roadside banners, flyers, radio interview, Bunnings promo day, raffle and word of mouth. The car park was quite full when I looked at various times. The canteen was kept busy serving hot food and drinks so many thanks to the ladies in the canteen and Glenn & Jeff on the BBQ.

We have a ¼ scale **Stinson Voyager 108** Kit by Realistic Models for sale which is part of the estate of the late Graham Waterhouse.

Wing span: 101.6"

Length: 75.5" or 77.7" depending on the model variant built.

Weight: 18 – 20 pounds.

Engine: 35 – 40cc petrol required.

As you can see the parts are still wrapped and sealed. There's lots of hardware and the cowl is extremely strong.

The kit contains an extensive amount of hardware and a sturdy fibreglass cowl.

It's untouched with all the parts still packaged and unopened.

This is without a doubt, a quality kit, albeit quite old now.

(A courier date on the box indicates it would have been manufactured around 1998.)

The promo booklet inside the box has been PDF'd which I can send if you are interested.

At the time, going by the promo booklet it would have sold for around \$1k.

So asking price is \$500 which I think is good value for the right person. However realistic offers will be considered, I'm simply trying to get a fair price for June.
